# Joseph Geiger, Jr. is Chosen as West Virginia's New State Historian and State Archivist

Commissioner Randall Reid-Smith of the West Virginia Division of Culture and History today announced that he has named Joe Geiger of Huntington as director of the agency's Archives and History Section, effective January 1, 2009. Geiger will be responsible for administering the state archives, archives library, historical collections and the database for the Veterans Memorial. Since 1998, Geiger has worked for Archives and History, serving as historian, Webmaster and assistant director. In November 2007 he was appointed acting director of the section. For the past 11 years he also has served as an adjunct professor in the history department at Marshall University. Before that, Geiger worked in the finance division for the City of Huntington.

"I love West Virginia and its

people and am passionate about its history," said Geiger. "I am honored to assume the duties as director of Archives and History, and blessed to work with an experienced staff that does exemplary work in collecting, preserving and making accessible the history of West Virginia and is dedicated to serving the people of the state." Reid-Smith said, "I am so pleased that Joe has accepted the position. For the last 10 years, he has shared his talents and enthusiasm for history and understands the value of our storied past. His knowledge and leadership skills are a great asset to the Division."

#### New Records Added to Vital Research Records Database

On January 1, 2009, another year's worth of records will be added to several categories of records available in the West Virginia Vital Research Records (WVVRR) Database on the West Virginia Archives and History Web site at http://www.wvculture.org/vrr. Counties for which birth records were available through 1907 will now have records for 1908, and West Virginia Dept. of Health death certificates will now be available through 1958. County death and marriage records will not change, already having been entered into the database up through the last year microfilmed, either 1967, 1968, 1969 or 1970, depending on the specific county. Also, the birth records of the six counties entered into WVVRR up through 1930 will not change.

The following counties should be loaded into the database by the end of January 2009, barring technical *Continued on page 3*

difficulties: Lincoln. McDowell. Monongalia, Monroe, Nicholas, Pleasants, Preston, Putnam, Raleigh, Ritchie, Roane, Summers, Webster, and Wetzel. As always, please notify us via the e-mail link (vrr@wv.culture.org) provided on the WVVRR Web site of any broken links, transcription errors, mismatched links and pages, etc. Remember that we can not correct any errors in the original record; however, in some circumstances we can add a cross-reference entry with the correctly spelled name for one badly garbled in the record itself, such as Swann for "Guom." (We do not have the staff time available to cross-reference names that are still recognizable or searchable as recorded, such as Bill and Bell, Dotson and Dodson, etc.)

Please read the article on Vital Research Records posted on the main WVVRR Web page for a full explanation of the records available and for search tips. The article will be updated this month once the next batch of counties are added.
