West Virginia County Records Management and Preservation Grants Program Accepting **Applications for 2006-2007 Projects**

The County Records Management for the RMPB program are and Preservation Grants Program, administered by the Records Management and Preservation Board (RMPB), will be accepting applications from county government offices through their county commissions for projects to implement records management programs. The grants are offered in support of the program's dual purpose of preserving the county records of West Virginia and of maintaining the accessibility of those records to the public. Grant guidelines and application forms will be mailed to County Commission offices on September 1, 2005, and are available on line at http:// www.wvculture.org/history/rmpb/ rmpb.html. All applications must be completed and mailed with a postmark on or before November 1, or hand-delivered by this date to the RMPB, c/o Fredrick Armstrong, Archives and History, Division of Culture and History. Applications

restricted to county commissions only.

Funds may be applied for projects to:

· Remove non-records and accumulations of records having reached or exceeded required retention periods from storage areas. particularly attics and basements, and the removal of justice of the peace books, personal property books and duplicate land books.

- Conduct complete records inventory and condition assessment, and develop a master records management plan for the county.
- Provide for the proper and improved storage and access to permanent records or records with required retention periods in excess of twenty-five years, such as

Clarification Regarding the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston Archives and the West Virginia Catholic Heritage Center

Ms. Tracey Rasmer, archivist for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston Archives, contacted us to clarify information in last month's article entitled West Virginia Catholic Heritage Center. The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston Archives is administered under the office of the Chancellor, located in a building called the Chancery, while the Archives itself is physically located in a separate building called the West Virginia Catholic Heritage Center (just as the Archives and History Library is administered by the Page 2

Archives and History section of the Division of Culture and History and is located in a building called The Cultural Center). Records available to the public include vital statistics from all Catholic parishes from 1828 to 1931 on microfilm, selected records of priests and bishops, information on deceased priests since the late 1890's, business records, property records and estate leases. The physical and mailing addresses for the Archives are the same: Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston Archives, West Virginia

mobile shelving systems or microfilm.

In this third round of grants, requests also will be considered for reformatting (converting) records scheduled as permanent, which require a high rate of access and for which an eye readable format exists or will be created (microfilm) and maintained as a security backup in proper environmental conditions.
