Archives and History Library Holiday Schedule Changes

While the Archives and History Library has been consistent for several years now regarding the holidays on which the Archives and History Library remains open to the public, several factors have led to some changes in 2008. The Library was closed on Primary Election Day this year, and will close again on General Election Day on November 4. The Archives and History Library also will close this year on the Friday and Saturday following Thanksgiving Day, November 28–29. Current plans are for the Library to remain open on Columbus Day and Veterans Day. Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve are half-day holidays, with the Library closing at 1:00 p.m., but that is always subject to change. When the Archives and History Library remains open on a holiday, only the Archives Library and The Cultural Center Great Hall will be open. All business offices of the Division of Culture and History, and the offices and library of the West Virginia Library Commission will be closed.

We suggest you contact us or check our Web site before coming on any holiday, in case the schedule has changed on short notice.

Capitol Complex Visitor Parking

While the employee parking garage is being repaired August 18 through November 30, employees with parking garage permits will be parking at Laidley Field as needed during this time. When the Laidley

Field parking lots are being used for staff parking, they will not be open for visitor parking. Visitor parking will be available only at the meters on the Complex on those days.

Applications are now being accepted for historic preservation survey and planning grants through the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) of the West Virginia Division of Culture and History. Eligible projects include architectural and archaeological surveys, preparation of nominations to the National

Jefferson County Jail Re-Dedication

In conjunction with Charles Town Heritage Days, a formal dedication of the restored historic Jefferson County Jail will take place on September 20. Following a County Commission vote in 2000 to demolish the jail, an organized preservation effort resulted not only in saving the structure, but a 2.3 million dollar restoration. The building now houses the Circuit Clerk's office, the Circuit Court, and a repository for Jefferson County documents. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the jail held miners and labor leaders on charges of murder, treason and more as a result of the Battle of Blair Mountain. The historic Jenkins Plantation Museum, located in the Green Bottom Wildlife Management Area of Cabell County, has been closed for preservation actions being taken by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The USACE anticipates
