**James William Parsons:**

James Parsons was born on January 13, 1813 at Horse Shoe in Randolph County. He served as a delegate to the Constitutional Convention from Tucker County. In 1863, Parsons moved to Kingwood in Preston County where he would spend the rest of his life working as a dry goods merchant and serving in local government. In Preston, he was elected a justice of the peace and served as the chairman of the Republican Committee of Preston County for many years. He died on February 1, 1892 and was buried at Kingwood.
